Answering your most pressing technical questions

Q: I downloaded Lion on one of my Macs. Can I use it on my laptop without downloading it all again?

A: Yes there is, and you should do this before you install Lion on the Mac you downloaded the software on.

In your computer's application folder, find "Install Mac OS X Lion" and control-click on it. Choose 'Show Package Contents' from the contextual menu.

This opens up a new window. Open the 'Contents' folder, and locate a folder within it called 'SharedSupport'.

Hold down the Option key and drag 'InstallESD.dmg' to your Desktop. This doesn't move the file, but makes a copy.

In the Menu Bar, click on 'Go' and select 'Utilities'. Locate and open 'Disk Utility' within the newly opened window.

Click on the program's 'Burn' button (top left of the interface), select the 'InstallESD.dmg' file on your Desktop, then hit the 'Return' key. Now insert a blank DVD-R disc and wait a while. Once finished, you'll have a brand new, fully functional Lion install DVD.



Steve Jobs: A look back

The news of his resignation may have been a surprise but it wasn't unexpected: Steve Jobs had been on his third medical leave since January. The first one was back in 2004 when he underwent treatment for a rare form of pancreatic cancer, then in 2009 to get a liver transplant. Yet during that time, he had a hand in creating amazing new innovations like never before, most notably the iPhone in 2007 and the iPad in 2010.

After having co-founded Apple in 1977 and taken over the Macintosh project in the early 80s, he got kicked out of Apple in 1985 after unsuccessfully trying to take over the CEO's duties. He founded NeXT, another computing company, only to sell it to Apple in 1997 when the latter was desperately looking for a new operating system. Jobs came back as an advisor but was soon in charge. Back then, Apple was three months away from bankruptcy and now, only fourteen years later it's the most valuable public company in the world. That's quite a turnaround and wouldn't have been possible without Steve's unique abilities.

As the new Chairman of the Board, he won't be involved in the day-to-day activities at Apple. It's obvious that this hasn't been an easy decision for him to make, and it's quite likely that his failing health forced him to step down. But he'll still be around, and the team around him is second to none and isn't going anywhere either. I'm personally looking forward to more "insanely great" products from the fruit company in the coming years.
